

MSKOMINI GIIZIS RESIDENCY

**AKI STUDIO
JULY 2 – 28, 2019**

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Monday, January 7, 2019

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:

Native Earth recognizes the need to sustain and invest in the deep development of Indigenous productions beyond the initial creation phase of workshop production, and beyond the first production.

The Mskomini Giizis Residency is open to Indigenous artists, collectives or companies across Canada. Native Earth will offer the selected candidate(s) the opportunity to further develop projects beyond the mid to late stage workshop development, or after first productions. This is a unique opportunity to revisit Indigenous work to realize its full potential. In consultation with Native Earth, the resident artist(s) will be given access to available resources that best serve the work. The residency is not intended for new creation or initial stages of development.

Native Earth will offer the selected candidate(s):

- Access to Aki Studio, including lighting and sound
- 30 hours of access to the head technician per week
- Up to \$40,000 to be used for artistic fees, additional technical crew, production resources, travel, as well as Indigenous apprentices and interns
- Up to 4 weeks in Aki Studio between July 2-28, 2019

ELIGIBILITY

Individuals:

To be eligible for the residency you must:

- Be a professional Indigenous artist
- Self-identify professionally as Indigenous – Status or Non-Status people, Inuit or Métis
- Be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada

Ad Hoc Groups or Collectives

To be eligible to apply for the residency you must:

- Be mostly composed of professional artists or arts professionals
- Have at least 50% Indigenous membership, and significant Indigenous creative leadership
- Not be an incorporated company

Not-for-Profit Organizations

To be eligible to apply for the residency you must:

- Be incorporated provincially or federally in Canada
- Be governed by a volunteer board of directors or an advisory board
- Have Indigenous artistic leadership and mandate

INELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Schools, colleges, universities, municipalities, or band councils

WHAT KIND OF ACTIVITIES DOES THE RESIDENCY FUND?

- Mid to late stage development of projects with confirmed or potential production dates.
- Also projects that have been produced and would benefit from additional production development.
- The Residency takes place in July 2019 in Aki Studio.

INELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES

- Fundraising activities
- Capital expenses

HOW MUCH CAN I APPLY FOR?

- You may apply for a maximum of \$40,000.
- If the project costs exceed \$40,000 and requires additional sources of funding, the individual, organization or collective should have alternative sources of funding.
- A cheque for 80% of the grant will be released upon signing a written agreement. The remaining 20% of the grant will be released upon completion of the project.

WHO MAKES THE DECISIONS ABOUT THE GRANTS?

Applications will be assessed by Native Earth staff. Applicants will be expected to complete the application form and budget. Finalists in the assessment process will be expected to complete an interview, and follow-up discussions about the project.

WHAT ARE THE DECISIONS BASED UPON?

Artistic Merit:

- Answers to the proposal questions
- Support Material (Audio/written/video), if applicable
- Key artist biographies and resumes
- Other relevant materials including letters of support and/or agreement
- Interviews

Impact:

- Indigenous artists involved
- The project's development trajectory
- Effect on Indigenous artists and audiences
- Answers to the proposal questions
- Interviews

Viability:

- Detailed answers to proposal questions
- Evidence of careful planning for the project
- Budget
- Interviews

The budget is an important part in the assessment of the viability of the project. Please be realistic in your budget. The total revenues and total expenses must balance.

WHEN DO I FIND OUT WHETHER MY RESIDENCY APPLICATION WAS SUCCESSFUL?

You will be notified in writing before March 30th, 2019 as to whether you receive the grant or not. All decisions are final.

Purpose and Use of the Funds

Native Earth funds will only be used for the purposes outlined in this application.

- If the project is changed substantially for any reason you will notify Native Earth in writing before the changes take place. Funding is dependent upon Native Earth’s approval of these changes.
- If the project does not or cannot go forward within the terms of the residency, you will return to Native Earth the funds granted for the proposed project.
- A T4A form will be issued to individual grant recipients by Native Earth and should be retained for income tax purposes.
- Your notification letter will contain a form requesting your social insurance number. You must complete this form and return it to Native Earth within three weeks of the date on the letter.
- You must maintain accounting records detailing the receipt and disbursement of funds received from Native Earth.
- You are required to submit a final report on how you used the grant.
- You are required to acknowledge Native Earth’s support of your project through the use of Native Earth’s logo.

1. What is your project?

3. What is the proposed schedule for creating the work? How does the residency fit into your future plans?

4. What are the mentorship, apprenticeship and training opportunities for Indigenous artists and arts professionals within the project?

5. What impact do you feel the residency could have on your project?

6. Are there any other sources of revenue for the residency? Are they confirmed or tentative?

7. Is there anything else you would like us to know about your project?

SUPPORT MATERIALS

Support materials can help explain or support the application. They may include any material such as manuscripts, resumes, digital stills, DVD's or brochures.

Support material is any documentation of your artistic practice or the project, and should be as recent as possible.

Each of the following is considered one example of support material:

- 10 images
- 1 audio recording (5 minutes maximum)
- 1 video recording (5 minutes maximum)
- 10 pages of written material (e.g. script, resumes or bios)
- 1-2 pages of project outline (timeline/work plan)
